- The scholarship is for students enrolling in full-time studies majoring in engineering, mechanical or technical studies.

- Write your **essay**, answering the questions listed on the first page of the application, and include it with your application.
- Request that your **school** send the Foundation an **official transcript** of your grades to date.
- Proofread your application and check it for completion. Mail or hand-deliver your application, including your essay, to the Foundation at the address listed above.

Applications must be received or postmarked by April 1, 2013.

Applications postmarked after that date will not be considered.

Notification of decisions will be mailed to all applicants by August 1, 2013.

- **Amount of award is based on unmet financial need** as determined by your college.
