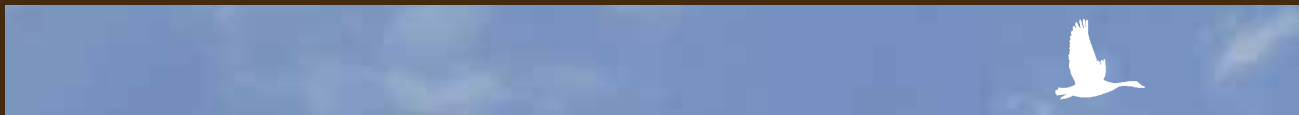


Leading by Example: A Tribute to Alex Velto



On December 17, 2009, the North Country lost one of its most staunch advocates. Alex C. Velto became executive director of the Northern New York Community Foundation in 1992. Over seventeen years, he transformed the organization in ways that will continue to benefit North Country residents for years to come. He was a champion for the less fortunate, and was instrumental in helping direct assistance to improve the quality of life for all the area's citizens.

Alex was also a great mentor, and he was passionate about the work that could be accomplished by a community foundation. He understood the challenges of students pursuing their dreams of higher education, especially those returning to school to better themselves. His life was about helping others - through the grants and scholarships he administered, through the advice and counsel he provided, and through his clear desire to see good projects and good people succeed.

While his legacy continues in the good work of the Community Foundation, it also lives through the ongoing good work of the individuals and organizations that

benefited from his guidance. He is missed each day. The gifts he gave to us are many, and we look to his legacy as an inspiration to forge our own.

Two days before Alex's untimely death, the Foundation's board of directors established the Alex Velto Community Fund "in recognition of Mr. Velto's dedication and commitment to the Northern New York Community Foundation and his steadfast efforts to positively impact the lives of the citizens of the North Country." Fortunately, the Foundation was able to make Alex aware that this had been done in his honor.

In creating the fund, the board allocated \$10,000 in seed money. Since then, through the contributions of many, the fund has grown to over \$60,000. We thank all who have contributed to the fund. (A listing can be found on page 48). Gifts to help grow the Alex Velto Community Fund can be made to the Northern New York Community Foundation. This permanent fund will be a tangible symbol of Alex's legacy and his tireless efforts on behalf of the Foundation and the community. We will work in conjunction with Alex's family to award grants that are consistent with the spirit in which he led his life.



2009-2010 Highlights

- **Over \$2.4 million in community grants were awarded.** An additional \$660,000 in long-term grant commitments were disbursed, including payments toward the Foundation's \$1.5 million grant to Samaritan Medical Center, \$150,000 grant to the Fort Drum Regional Health Planning Organization, \$100,000 grant to public television (St. Lawrence Valley Educational Television), and \$45,000 to North Country Public Radio.
- **Scholarships totaling \$1,380,538** to over 692 students were awarded from 2009 to 2010.
- **43 new permanent funds were established** by individuals, businesses and organizations to achieve a variety of donor objectives.



My two-year term as President of the Northern New York Community Foundation presented the Board of

Directors and me with challenges and opportunities that no one could have predicted. I am proud of how well we met those challenges and made the most of those opportunities. Enthusiasm is strong and hopes are high as we focus on the Foundation's future. We are succeeding in our goal to promote a greater sense of philanthropy within the communities in our tri-county area. I am confident the decisions the Foundation makes in support of future programs and initiatives will continue to uphold our tradition of promoting broad scale change in our region.


- **We maintained our scholarship budget**, despite economic uncertainty. In 2011, our scholarship awards will exceed \$700,000 for the first time in the Foundation's history.
- **Established a Youth Philanthropy Council** in partnership with Watertown High School. The 14 members of the Council recommended grants totaling \$5,000. In 2011, they will have the opportunity to award \$7,500 in community grants.
- **Formed a St. Lawrence County Advisory Council** to help guide grantmaking efforts. Over the last four years, over \$400,000 in grants have been made and \$120,000 in scholarships have been awarded in St. Lawrence county.
- **Established the Spirit of Philanthropy Award.** This award will be presented periodically to recognize individuals or organizations whose achievements exemplify a commitment toward helping and inspiring others through the spirit of giving.
- **Renewed the Friends of the Foundation Fund.** Over \$50,000 in gifts were made to this fund in support of the Foundation's programs in 2010.
- **Expanded the Foundation's grantmaking committee membership** to include more community input and participation.
- **Awarded first Alex Velto Community Fund grant.** This permanent fund, established in 2009, honors the Foundation's former executive director.
- **The River Fund was established** by the family of Everett Foster. This fund is being built and added to by many donors and will become a resource for organizations of the River communities in perpetuity.
- **The Foundation's Facebook page launch** extended the reach of the Foundation's communications.

The River Fund

Everett G. Foster had a long affiliation with the Northern New York Community Foundation, including serving as a member of its board from 1985 to 1995. Many organizations benefited from Rett's commitment and passion for enhancing the quality of life for the residents of the North Country. Upon his death in 2010, his family was looking for a way to honor and perpetuate the legacy of giving that symbolized his life's work, but also to provide a permanent fund administered by the Foundation to benefit organizations of the River communities.

Many generous gifts have been made to provide initial funding for this initiative. As the fund continues to grow, it has great potential to positively impact an area of Northern New York that holds great meaning for many. Most recently, memorial gifts were received to recognize Morse Dial's legacy. We thank all who have contributed to the fund (a listing can be found on page 49). Field of Interest Funds

George R. Davis Fund for Lowville

When George R. Davis passed away in 2010, he had already demonstrated a great commitment to Lewis County. A former Lewis County District Attorney and later County, Surrogate and Family Court Judge, he made a provision through his will to establish a permanent fund to benefit the Town of Lowville. Each year, grants will be made in his name to support projects and organizations in his hometown.

Garrett Loomis Firefighters Fund

In April 2010, a silo explosion took the life of Sackets Harbor Assistant Fire Chief Garrett W. Loomis. This fund was established to provide grants to fire departments to assist with training or equipment for agricultural related emergencies with the hope of lessening the chance of similar tragedies in the future.

Jan B. Oliver Lifelong Reading Fund

Established by James Oliver in honor of his mother, grants will be made in her name, in perpetuity, to support projects and initiatives related to reading and literacy.

Through a bequest from Watertown resident Carolyn Whitney, this fund provides a permanent source of annual support for tree planting efforts within the City of Watertown.

Scholarship Funds

Sarah Burgoon Memorial Scholarship Fund

Shortly after graduating from Alexandria Central School in 2006, Sarah died in an automobile accident. This fund was established in her memory and will award an annual scholarship to graduating Alexandria Central seniors in perpetuity.

Matt Doheny Scholarship Fund

North Country native Matt Doheny established this permanent fund to support area students but also in appreciation for the Community Foundation scholarship he received in 1988. A scholarship is awarded each spring to a local high school graduate.

Donald J. Grant Scholarship Fund

Donald J. "Dutch" Grant began his career in education in 1946 at Dexter High School. He later became superintendent of the General Brown School District, a position he held from 1972 until his retirement in 1993. He also served as mayor of the Village of Dexter from 1966 to 2007. Through his estate, Mr. Grant provided for a fund that will provide scholarships annually to North Country students in perpetuity.

Kelli Johnson Memorial Scholarship Fund

Kelli was a 1999 graduate of Indian River Central School and died in a motor vehicle accident in 2003. This scholarship fund was created in her memory and is awarded each year to a graduating Indian River student.

Daisy Allard Jamerson & Dorothy Jamerson Eckford Scholarship Fund

Georgia residents David and Hildred Allard established this fund to honor two family members who spent their lives in Northern New York. By doing so, a scholarship is awarded each year to an area student pursuing their higher educational dreams.

Douglas & Helen Murray Scholarship Fund

Doug and Helen Murray and their children have established this permanent fund to provide educational opportunities to North Country students.

North Country Human Resource Association Scholarship Fund

The Association established this college scholarship for traditional and non-traditional students residing in Jefferson or Lewis county, pursuing a business-related field of study.

Janet Ostanek Memorial Scholarship Fund

This fund was created to honor the memory of Janet Ostanek. Ms. Ostanek was a language teacher in the Watertown City School District for many years. It is awarded each year to a graduating Watertown High School student.

Gail Conlin Phillips Memorial Scholarship Fund

Gail Phillips was an educator at Watertown High School from 1968 to 1996. Upon her death in 2007, a fund was created in her memory to honor her teaching legacy. Each year, a scholarship is awarded at graduation ceremonies at Watertown High.

Charlotte J. Smith, a life-long resident of Carthage, was a mathematics and science teacher in the Watertown City School District from 1962 to 1996. When she passed away in 2009, she left a provision in her will to create a scholarship fund for area students pursuing chemistry at Syracuse University.

Mr. Tompkins made a charitable bequest that created a scholarship fund for the benefit of women's educational needs.

An Investment in St. Lawrence County

Although prior to 2008, the Northern New York Community Foundation made periodic grants in St. Lawrence County, since then, the Foundation has been aggressively seeking ways to demonstrate the impact a community foundation can have on a region. Since actively pursuing grantmaking opportunities there, nearly \$500,000 in grants and \$120,000 in scholarships have been awarded in St. Lawrence County communities.

Leaving a Legacy to the Community

Charitable bequests are an important way Americans make lasting contributions to their communities. If your will includes a bequest to the Foundation, we thank you for your thoughtfulness. We invite you to inform us if you have named the Foundation so that we may acknowledge you along with the other special people who have made future commitments. The confidentiality of all bequest provisions is maintained. However, if your completed will does not include a charitable bequest, you might consider adding one through a codicil.

Because a charitable bequest is fully deductible from your estate, significant tax savings may result. These savings enable many people to make a charitable gift while preserving most of the legacy they intended for their heirs. You don't need a large estate to make a bequest. It can be of any size and can take many forms.

Some individuals have established living trusts instead of having a will. Such trusts can include charitable provisions similar to other types of bequests.

It is important to provide the exact name of any charity you name as beneficiary so that your gift can be transmitted correctly. For the Foundation, the proper designation is the Northern New York Community Foundation, Inc.

The Northern New York Community Foundation, Inc. serves many donors with a variety of charitable interests. Gifts are tax-deductible and may be made during the donor's lifetime, by bequest in a will, or a combination of both.

- **Charitable Bequests** - A donor designates that the Foundation is to receive a specific amount, a percent of the estate or a piece of property.
- **Charitable Gift Annuity** - In exchange for a gift of cash or securities, a donor receives a guaranteed, fixed annual payment for life. When the annuity terminates, a permanent fund is established in the donor's name. This fund may be used to support a local charitable organization.
- **Charitable Trusts** - Tailor a charitable lead or remainder trust to your unique philanthropic and financial objectives.
- **Outright Gifts** - Any of the above can result in building or establishing the following:
 - Friends of the Foundation Fund** - Provides an opportunity for the donor to make an annual contribution to the Foundation's programs, or make periodic contributions to the Foundation's community endowment.
 - Unrestricted Fund** - Designed to meet the future needs of a changing community by providing maximum flexibility for future grantmaking.
 - Field of Interest Fund** - Ensures permanent support for a special area of interest while allowing future flexibility.
 - Nonprofit Fund** - Creates a lasting gift in your name to help meet the present and future needs of a designated charity or charities.
 - Scholarship Fund** - Improve the lives of students with a permanent source for higher education funding.
 - Individual or Business Donor Advised Fund** - Recommend annual grants for the causes you care about most. If desired, design a family or business grantmaking plan that includes the next generation. Establishing a fund is like having a private foundation - without the administrative work and expense.
 - Naming** - You may establish or contribute to any of the above funds in your name or your family's name or in memory or in honor of a friend or loved one.



FINANCIALS

Through prudent stewardship of these community assets, we strive to maximize grant and scholarship dollars while ensuring that the funds entrusted to us will continue to grow to support our region in perpetuity.

As of April 30, 2011, the Foundation held total assets of nearly \$41 million. The investment portfolio is managed by the Finance Committee and Board of Directors, working closely with local investment managers who monitor several national managers.

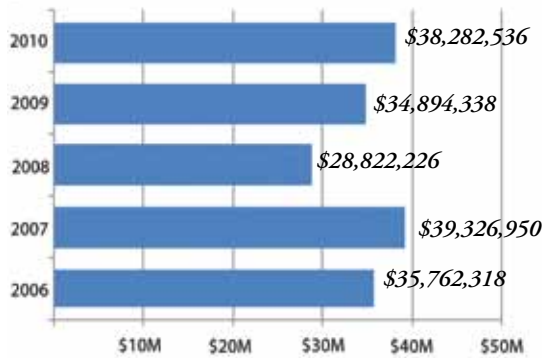

Total Assets by Year

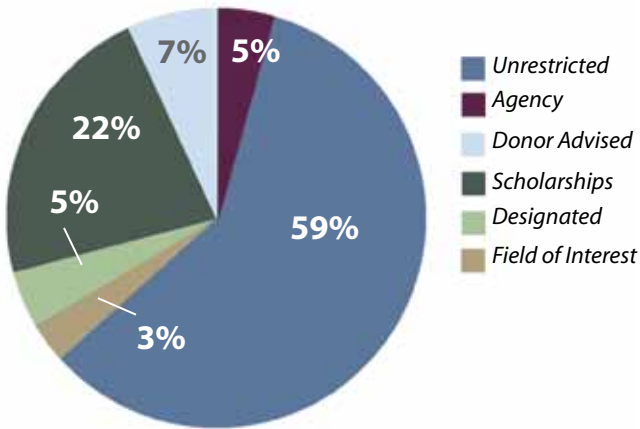

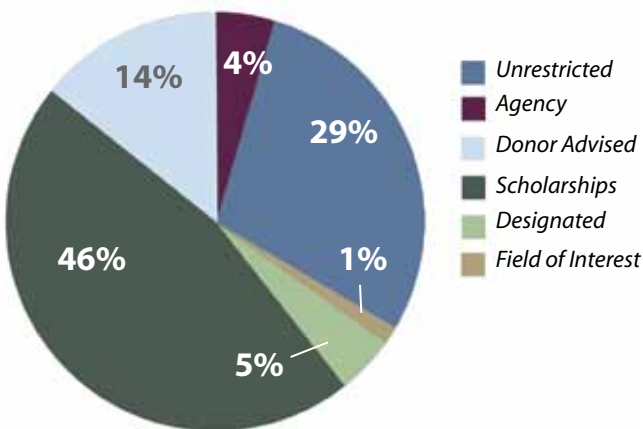
Total Grants by Year



Assets by Fund Type (2009-10)

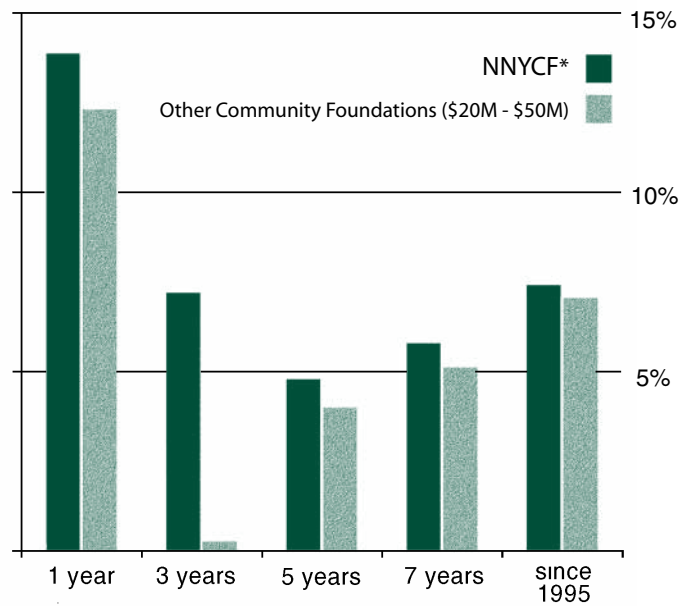


Grants by Fund Type (2009-10)
